

you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. Matthew 7:7

AS we journeyed through Lent, I was working on our next worship series. It's a big one! It's the series where I've promised to involve the whole church in discerning where God is taking Wesley next. Yes! How are we to use our gifts, talents, and resources to serve our Lord? We want everyone to have an ear to God and a voice in this process.

As I prepared, I thought about Nehemiah's story and the rebuilding of the wall of Jerusalem. I spent some time praying over how this story might speak to us regarding discerning our next faithful steps. Frustratingly, it just did not come together, and I was getting a little anxious about having this series ready.

Before I tell you about the miracle that happened, let me explain what we are seeking to accomplish. For any organization to function well, it must have a mission and a vision. WAIT! Please don't tune me out here. I assure you, what is going to happen at Wesley is nothing like the often eye-watering and teeth-grinding process of working on a mission and vision in a business. Please read on.

Fortunately, we already have a mission. Jesus established the mission of the church 2000 years ago, and it has not changed. I'll talk about that on April 14th. Furthermore, I believe God already has a vision for us. We don't need to develop one. We simply need to hear from God. Thank you, Lord!!

Now, when I say **vision**, I'm not talking about a statement we hang up in the entryway or the fellowship hall. I'm not talking about a slogan we stick at the end of our emails or on our letterhead. The vision we are seeking from God is our collective understanding of who we are as a church and what we are to be doing. Our vision will be that deep belief, shared by all of us, as to how we are called to fulfill the mission Jesus has already given us.




It's not really a list of ministries or missions. It's the heartfelt sense we collectively feel that God has called us to a particular direction and specific results from what we do in the world. When a church understands God's vision for it, most everyone is serving, praying, and giving in that same direction.

Now, back to the miracle. When I realized that the Nehemiah story was not a fit, I knew God had another plan. I sat in my office on a quiet day. I put a notepad on my knee, picked up a pen, and said, "Okay, God, what is your plan for this series? How are we to involve everyone in discovering your plan?" I've spent time listening in prayer before, but this was like I was ready to take dictation. Before long I knew God was whispering Matthew 7:7 to me: Ask, and you shall receive. Seek, and you shall find. Knock, and the door will be opened for you. Any anxiousness left as I knew God was confirming that we are doing what God desires. Asking, seeking, and knocking are God's immediate plans for us. But that did not clarify a Sunday series to lead us through our seeking. I sat and listened a bit more. Trying hard not to talk- a silent seeking. My eyes landed on a familiar book on my bookshelf. I knew instantly this was God pointing it to me. Still, I argued with God a little that there has to be another path for the series.

I relented, picked up the book, and began looking at the chapter headings. The title of the book is "Experiencing God" by Blackaby and King. I sensed God saying, "I'm inviting the people of Wesley into an experience of my love.

Several Wesley regulars have expressed interest in joining the church. On April 28th,




UMC General Conference Starts in April

Our denomination's General Conference will take place from April 23 through May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina. This body is made up of clergy and laity from United Methodist churches around the globe. More than 1,000 legislative petitions aiming to shape the denomination's future will be before these delegates. Let's pray for this monumental effort and ask that God's Spirit preside over the deliberations.

If the past is any indication of what to expect during this event and immediately after, we will likely hear numerous inaccurate and partial reports. Further, things decided at the General Conference must then be deemed permitted by our Judicial Council. That means decisions sometimes get reversed. May we be careful not to be part of the confusion.

Regardless of the outcomes, our church leaders are ready to consider any effects on our church and determine if actions should be taken. We will seek to be transparent about this process. If at any point you feel confused or uncomfortable about what you are hearing, please talk to us. We will be glad to hear your concern and help with providing as much clarity as possible.

Once the dust settles from the General Conference and any expected Judicial Council responses, if there are changes that could affect us as a church, Pastor Bob and Wesley leaders will hold Q&A sessions for those with questions. These Q&A sessions will be offered both in-person and online. No question is a stupid question. If you have a concern, let's talk.



We have begun a project to listen to the leading of our Shepherd and to discern what are our next faithful steps as a church. Listening activities for each of us will ramp up after Easter. For now, please faithfully pray this prayer as part of our daily time with God.

God, open our hearts and our ears.

Let us hear the voice of our Shepherd and follow. Amen

The Work of Our Faithful Trustees

Wow, a lot has been going on! Our Trustees and others helping them have:

- Documented and enhanced our **water treatment system** as prescribed by the Department of Environmental Protection
- Met with our elevator maintenance company to ensure we are in compliance with the inspections that the state and our insurance company require
- Received a bid from ARCS, our HVAC vendor, to repair the furnace boiler. We scheduled the repair for September. The cost will be \$8000.00—more about that below
- Cleaned up and prepared our facility (inside and outside) for the Lenten Brunch.
- Effected repair and planned additional work on our floor scrubber, which is not performing well
- Installed new upper parking lot lights
- Coordinated numerous rentals, including MPR setup
- Worked on our live stream setup to adjust for recent network changes
- Obtained approval and funding from the Trust Fund committee to purchase 2 new office PCs
- Obtained approval and funding from the Trust Fund committee to purchase **oil-based candle-lighting equipment** to make alter candles easier for acolytes to light
- Replaced a broken paper towel dispenser in the preschool restroom
- Ordered additional propane
- Installed several motion sensor lighting fixtures in hallways

Yes, our boiler was temporarily fixed. We're praying it gets us through this heating season. The Boiler is constructed in



segments. Several segments will need to be replaced. ARCS, our HVAC vendor, always takes very good care of us. They have indicated that the repair will cost \$8,000.00. We've scheduled this repair before the next heating season in September. Without redirecting your giving to our regular budget or capital campaign, If God leads you, will you help us make this climb to repairing our boiler? As always, thank you for your faithful stewardship.



What at ride! When you receive this newsletter, our Wesley Family will be fresh off the Lent Express and Easter; filling our souls with grateful recognition, positive affirmation, and refreshed determination to follow Jesus' examples-honoring his sacrifice. As we all struggle with the realities of the world beyond our community, one only needs to partake of and share Wesley on the Hill to be mindful of the positivity we radiate.

I truly hope you were one of the many who attended the Lenten Brunch & Music Celebration, nothing but smiling faces after the time of singing, eating, and enjoying community conversations. How nice it was for Wesley to host and help bring like-minded people of the community together at our House of Worship on the Hill. The Council of Churches is now planning to discuss the possibility of holding additional similar events. On Saturday March 23rd the kids had a great time hunting for eggs, followed by moving from country to country (table to table) learning, crafting, and building friendships in Wesley's safe place on the hill. March was a very busy month with all things Easter coming early and crammed into one month.

These events and many others are all happenings that turn into experiences for Wesley Family, friends, and community and you make them possible through your continued support. Thank you! Because of your dedication, we have made up for our missed Sundays and have been able to maintain our financial momentum, allowing us to continue to change lives and invite others to join us at Wesley on the Hill.

Below are Finance updates for you as we work hard to keep our "House" in order. Good, not so good, and happy there is no ugly to report:

- Lenten Offering: As of this writing I do not have a total for the Lenten Envelope offering but thank you in advance! We will be sharing half to the Marysville Fire Co. and half to the East Pennsboro EMS Ambulance Service; our First Responders who are always there when we need them!
- Hope for the Future Capital Campaign: On March 10, we were able to pay \$20,000 directly on principal!! Thank you to the special people who understand how much this can help Wesley's operating and future. We are approaching the 2-year mark, in May, of our original 3-year campaign. So far, we have paid \$201,000 toward our principle. Of the \$50,000 gift from the Susquehanna Conference, we have \$22,500 left which we use to supplement our quarterly mortgage interest payments. The portion are not covered fully by offering gifts to the Building Fund. We are happy to be able to continue to apply every dollar you give toward the Capital Campaign directly to principle. And lastly, we have an accumulated balance of \$1,000 right now prior to Easter Sunday, rebuilding from your support to be able to apply another principal payment sometime in April. Thank you!
- Heating Season: Your gifts enabled us to pay the \$3400 propane bill from January, and we will only need about \$800 delivered this week to finish out our propane heating season. Meanwhile, the next update is both good and not so good! The central oil-fired boiler leak was stopped (for now) with appropriate chemicals. That

was a mini gift that it could be contained and then stopped. However, analysis and subsequent contractor estimates indicate we should move forward with a repair. The good news is because the boiler is brand name and not real old, they can replace sections to make it whole again. The dampener on that is the estimate is \$8,000 or more. It is likely the Trustees will move forward with this in August or Sept. This expense would normally come out of the Property Fund. Pray we can accomplish that without depleting our emergency property reserves.

 Office Upgrade: New computers will be coming in soon to replace the desktop computers (ancient!) our office now uses. The plan is to hopefully complete installation, testing, back up, and synchronization for May. While necessary for security and speed, it will much improve function for Wesley.

Technology Assessment: The power outage and related equipment failures we experienced pointed out that we need to do a top to bottom shake down review and plan for our future, which will provide an accurate assessment of our capabilities. Trustees will oversee the assembly of a church wide exploratory committee to begin a review process of inventory, assessment, and eventual final evaluation for planning present and future needs. Your input is welcome. Yes, that will cover a wide range of technology. In today's similar operations, everything is tied into the in-house network including the copier, phone system, and any security devices. But since the buck stops with Finance, I feel an obligation to help you, our family of faithful supporters, know that your church strives to safeguard your interests (Continued on page 8 - FINANCE)

Ask Jesus to make you like a beautiful "wellwatered garden."

The Lord will guide you continually, giving you water when you are dry and restoring your strength. You will be like a well-watered garden, like an ever-flowing spring. Isaiah 58:11 (NLT)

For years I had dreamed about lush flower gardens, and even filled a notebook with pictures of beautiful flowers and various styles of gardens. Each time I found a new idea online or in a garden magazine, I'd show my husband. I knew gardening was my passion, not his, so I tried to be careful not to pressure him. I never thought my dreams would become reality.


But a few years ago he actually suggested we draw up some ideas for a perennial garden. I was in garden heaven, creating, planning, choosing—and then planting several garden areas. They were not as exquisite as the ones in my idea notebook, but they were beautiful to me. ing, but gardens. Gardening requires maintenance: watering, fertilizing, mulching, and yes, pulling weeds. At times, the work is overwhelming just to keep the garden growing and beautiful. Maintenance was low on my "enjoyable" list. But, oh, the joy of sitting in my garden among the fragrant flowers! It is well worth the work.

The Christian life is sometimes like that. We fall in love with Jesus, with His Word, with becoming more Christlike. Everything looks beautiful. Until the maintenance comes. The discipline of faithfulness challenges us; temptation distracts us; and difficulties threaten to overwhelm us. Growth requires intentionality. To keep the garden of our heart beautiful and well-watered, we must cooperate with Jesus, the Master Gardener. Sometimes, that work costs us time, comfort, pain. But a well-watered, maintained garden—whether a physical one or a spiritual one—will proclaim His beauty. Jesus makes all the work worthwhile.

FAITH STEP: Do you enjoy gardens or gardening? Ask Jesus to make you like a beautiful "well-watered garden." Cooperate with Him today by including a spiritual discipline such as time in His Word, prayer, or Bible study.
