Walking the Trails, **Following God's Path**

There's a trailhead across the parking lot from the church that leads into the Hammer woods of Cove

Mountain. Managed by the Nature Conservancy, the paths wind through tall trees and rise and fall across the mountainside. If you hike far enough, the trails occasionally open to a cutout overlook. I often walk these trails with Debbie and our dog, Ollie. Other times it's just Ollie and me. I've walked the pink, yellow, green, and blue trails. I'm planning on tackling orange this fall.

When I'm out there in the mountains, something happens. The quiet settles in, and before long I find myself praying—sometimes with words, sometimes just with silence. The rhythm of walking seems to make space for God. The beauty

of nature helps fill my prayers with praise and glory to God.

When I come across a lookout, Ollie and I will stop, sit on a bench or a stone, and catch our breath. The views are captivating. I often look for features I recognize. I can sit

there for a long time and let the stillness and beauty wash over me. Those pauses are good and necessary. But I never stay there forever. Ollie will remind me that this is, after all, a hike. The trail calls us onward. When we start walking, now further up the mountain, the scenery has changed. The trees look a little different, the air feels different, and I realize I am further along the path than before.

For me, these hikes are a metaphor for life with God. And it feels a lot like the life of our church. We travel together as God leads us. We enjoy God. God blesses us with moments to pause, moments when we can rest, give thanks, and enjoy what God has done among us. The view can

be captivating, awe-inspiring. But God also calls us to keep walking. The blessing of the past is not the end of the story. However, the trail continues, and new things await.

As a congregation, we have truly been enjoying the blessings of God. The view of God's grace has been glorious. While we won't stop celebrating what we've seen God do, now God is calling us to step forward once again. He has set before us some important paths:

1. Green Trail - Growing our children's ministry by moving from one room children's church to two age-appropriate classes. We are already well on this path. It means that 3-4 people each week will be with the children, leading and teaching them during worship. Is God calling you to help with our children? We are looking to share the adventure, so you would not be

> helping every week, but will alternate with others willing to serve our children. We are in need of additional help.

2. Yellow Trail - Fully living into Safe Sanctuaries so that all children, youth, and vulnerable adults can trust that this is a safe place. And so that volunteers know they are protected as well. We have improved significantly in our compliance with the

requirements of Safe Sanctuaries. However, we need to update our policy and make the final strides to ensure full compliance. Sandy Corl has graciously volunteered to be our Safe Sanctuaries coordinator. We will gather a team to review and enhance our policy. Is God calling you to assist?

SCRIPTURE READING: Psalm 27:1-5 / 1 Samuel 17:32-37 & 41-45

MESSAGE: "David and the question, "Am I Safe?"

September 28, 2025

16th Sunday after Pentecost

THEME: Ruth's world is turned upside down by loss: her husband dies, and she chooses to leave behind her homeland, and her safety net to care for her mother-in-law in a foreign land. As a widowed Moabite woman in Israel, Ruth is extremely vulnerable. Her question could easily have been: "Am I secure?" - Will I be provided for? Will I be accepted? Do I have a future?

But Ruth steps out in faith, clinging to Naomi and to Israel's God. In Bethlehem, she humbly gathers leftover grain behind harvesters, risking rejection. Yet God provides—not only through Boaz's kindness but through inclusion in the line of King David and ultimately Christ.

SCRIPTURE READING: Psalm 16:5-11 / Ruth 2:1-13 **MESSAGE:** "Ruth and the question 'Am I Secure?'"

seem to hold so much influence over your life? Have you found yourself coming back to the same insecurity in your work, in relationships, in finances, in seemingly every area of your life? We're launching a new sermon series looking at the simple but powerful questions that drive us —Am I safe? Am I loved? Am I good enough? Etc.

These honest, personal, and hard questions have spiritual answers. Left unanswered, our most profound questions can drive us into difficulties in our faith, our relationships, and in every area of our lives. We are going to look at seven questions, one or two of which drive most of us. We'll explore how God, our Creator, answers our deepest human needs with truth, reassurance, and purpose. Once the questions underneath our lives are answered in Christ, those answers can become our greatest strengths.

Pastor Bob and Licensed Counselor Jeff Wolfe will team up to preach this series starting September 21, 2025. You won't want to miss this!

3. Pink Trail - Strengthening the connection between our church and our preschool, so that families who bring their children here can also experience the love of Christ in the life of our church. The preschool has been financially well supported by the church. We celebrate its success. We celebrate its accomplishments, but we have not been in the lives of preschool families so as to love and support them into the family of God. It's time for us to build this connection so Preschool families feel God's love from us. Here again, we'll pull together a team to begin developing a multi-year strategy that tightly couples our church life and preschool life. Is God calling you to help in this initiative?

These are not just "projects." They are the journey God is calling us to walk. They remind us that God is still leading, still calling, still shaping us for what's ahead. We have not worked out all the details of how we will hike these paths. However, we know this is what God has ahead for us. We will be faithful to follow.

One other change that will help facilitate our journey is to begin managing our finances in a more unified fashion. We will be making some changes to the envelopes for 2026 that will make stewardship of our finances more straightforward. See David's finance article in this newsletter for a bit more detail.

The psalmist once wrote, "I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord,

who made heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:1–2). Those words take on fresh meaning when you're standing on a mountain lookout, breathing in the air, experiencing the view, and remembering who holds the path beneath your feet as well as the path ahead.

The woods of Cove Mountain remind me that the lookouts and their vistas are fantastic, but they are not the destination. The complete joy is found in walking. And the gift is knowing we do not walk alone.

As you read this newsletter, we see a successful Vacation Bible School, the blessing of the kids' backpacks, and the start of schools in summer's rearview mirror. You certified old timers reading this will remember school used to start right after Labor Day and end right around Memorial Day. Yessiree, I'm personally admitting that I'm certified. As with everything else these days, like prices, packaging contents, and the wait time to speak to a real person, creeping up or shrink creep is the norm. Schools starting on August 20th and ending for the summer the first week of June (the coming year May 29) is an example of creep in our lives we've become accustomed to. I want to encourage you to explore the good side of creep. Try creeping over to say hello to your neighbors, creep up to Wesley on the Hill for one of our many activities and events on a day other than Sunday. Slow to a creep and let someone out of a parking lot in front of you, creep your friends by giving them a hug or gift for no reason at all. Soon after you read this newsletter, you will see fall's advance notices

creeping into our lives. I have already seen some yards with Halloween decorations along with football and all of fall's sports. We know it is pre-fall time. Then there is "pumpkin spice everything" which is a seasonal personal addiction for many folks!

As part of our Fall experience, let us all plug into Wesley on the Hill, recharge, support our activities and mission, while knowing that our giving keeps Wesley thriving and supports our programs where all are welcomed with open arms.

Current Finance Happenings:

Parsonage Garage Repairs - All done but some final touches, paperwork, and covering the \$2500 insurance deductible.

Storm Water Borough Project -Reviewing proposed legal agreement while the engineering firm completes their project details and access. The key part for us is exemption from the storm water fee assessment, improvements, and maintenance of our retention pond becoming the Borough's responsibility.

Marysville Borough Grease Ordinance - Met with the Borough Manager, our request for exemption or reduced compliance was acknowledged. We are hopeful that common sense will be applied not just to Wesley but to most of the churches and non-profit organizations in town.

Wesley Kitchen Freezer Obit - After 17 years, our primary freezer in the kitchen is going to the appliance hereafter. Estimate of \$1500 to repair with no guarantee how long the fix might last. Trustees are currently shopping for a replacement. Early estimates peg our anticipated cost around \$2500 up to as much as \$3500+. We welcome any contributions toward the new freezer.

Wesley Preschool Expanded to 4 days per week - This has been received with positive favorable comments. The additional day should not have a large impact on our utility bills. Conversely, that extra day that your giving helps to provide can have a large impact on many young impressionable children! (Thank you!)

Wesley Revised Budgeting and Streamlined Accounting - As you know, our many years of "Honest Prayers" in earnest looking for a way to manage our mortgage have been answered. While we have recovered from our celebration jumping up and down, shouting to the heavens, I can't help myself. Every time I am reminded of our zero percent mortgage, I break out into a large smile! We are now working on simplifying, streamlining, and accepting your gracious giving for use where and how it will best serve Wesley. More will be shared as we make progress in revamping a decadeold old system that we now are empowered to modernize and improve. Know that Pastor Bob, myself, and your leadership team welcome your questions and input.

The following are in rough planning stages:

- 2026 giving envelopes will receive your gifts into Current Expenses, which is our general fund that everything Wesley feeds from. Individual boxes formally labelled Property, Building, and Capital Campaign will go away.
- Fear not, new multi-purpose giving envelopes will be available on our offering table and in the pews to accommodate specific gifts, special projects, and special causes that our hearts lead us to.
- New easy online giving availability.
- Thank you in advance for your acceptance of our need to modernize and make changes for Wesley and the Wesley Family's benefit.

Coming up in our pre-fall state of mind, we will be filling our propane tanks in preparation for the heating season. Normally, this is the lowest pricing of the year, however, this year




