After we spent a year as a church listening to God's leading and considering where he's taking us, on March 2, I had the privilege of sharing with you what our Wesley leaders unanimously believe is God's call to us. God has said to us.

"My Wesley Family, invite everyone—beginning with children—to know and trust Me. Do this by beginning always with prayer. Then, I want all of you to share my love through fun and encouraging Bible-based activities that grow everyone in their faith and build deep, grace-filled friendships. As you do this, look for ways to partner with this community inside and outside your church walls."

I think of Paul's words as he wraps up a letter to the Thessalonians... "This is the will of God concerning you."

People of Wesley, we must now turn our attention to where God is calling us. We must not think of this vision just as some marketing splash. It's not just a slogan or a fancy statement to put in our literature. We need to measure ourselves and our activities by what we now know God is asking us to do. We must plan to accomplish this and to help bring everyone along on the project God is handing us. How will you do that? Let me offer some ways you can begin.

Prayer

As you can see, God is asking us to make prayer the foundation of the vision he is calling us to. So, begin with prayer. The quote above is obviously my verbal construction. But I've drawn it directly from the vision our leaders unanimously agreed is God's call for us. In prayer, read this quote. Hear it as God's call to us and to you. Listen for the leading of the Holy Spirit. Ask God for God's wisdom and endurance for us to carry out God's design for our faith community. If you sense a leading to act, please come talk with me right away.

Planning

We must also build a basic plan to do as God has instructed. Think of this as our strategy. We are forming a **Strategic Planning Team** to help bring this vision to life. This team will prayerfully consider how we can align our ministries, resources, and efforts with what God has called us to do. Will you be part of this team? If so, please come see me.

Our First Strategic Step

Our children's ministries have grown. This has been one way God has spoken clearly to us. But imagine grouping together all the children and babies in one room and hoping to try to nurture their faith. That is not a formula for success. It's not honoring God or our children.

To be fair to the children and to those leading children's ministries, we need to reorganize Children's Church. It's past time to provide a staffed place for babies during church and to make a classroom for the preschool children separate from the elementary students. That's three separate classes: Nursery, Preschool, and Elementary. Let me clarify: children and infants are always welcome to

remain with their parents. However, If we are to follow where God is leading, we must offer something appropriate to each age.

The right way to do this takes 12 or more volunteers. Each volunteer would have two weeks a month caring for the children and two weeks worshiping in the service. Now, Safe Sanctuaries, which is part of what God is calling us to be passionate about, requires two unrelated adults as leaders in each group. For the three children's groups, we need a total of 12 people in the rotation who will care for our children. Remember that we already have 4-5 regularly serving, so we likely need around eight more.

As a volunteer, you will be provided with the material needed for the age group you serve. You do not need to have great skill or ability with these materials. They are designed for church volunteers. We will also provide an introduction to your role. Will you consider serving our children? If you are considering serving, please come talk to Amy Whitworth or me.

God is calling all of us to be part of this new direction. Let's get underway with the work God is calling us to do. Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me."

Finance Highlights & Areas of Need:

<u>Lenten Offering:</u> Your gifts will go to rebuild our Trustee's Property Account back to a sustaining level for repairs and maintenance of our facilities. Recent expenses for the boiler, elevator, safety lights, and winter weather road services have depleted the account.

<u>Current Expenses:</u> Thank you for your gifts to the Current Expense Account, you understand and your faithful gifts continue to keep our sanctuary on the hill, mission focused and welcoming. The colder and windier winter we have experienced increased our utilities (oil, propane, & electric) combined costs this winter by \$4,000. Just like at our homes, the cold weather has taken a toll on our budgets; just larger for our Wesley Home.

Hope for the Future, Capital Reduction Campaign: As we near the end of our successful mortgage reduction campaign, Thank You to all who have given, pledged, and gifted extra to reducing our mortgage and associated interest. After almost three years we are at our original goal of \$300,000, all gifts counted to date. Continuing through April and May culminating on May 25th, let us exceed our own expectations, and see what we can squeeze out for this important cause. Every dollar we can pay to decrease the principal saves us mortgage interest money. Thank you again to all who have given to reduce our mortgage costs. Let us finish strong as we celebrate Wesley's Harvest of Hope at a special service recognizing how God strengthened our resolve to save Wesley in these changing times. Our service of celebration on Sunday May 25th not only recognizes your committed gifts but highlights that you have enabled Wesley on the Hill to seek the vision for God's Mission for our future.

Call it ironic that at the same time Perry County is reassessing our home and business values for tax purposes (double ugh!), we have undertaken a similar project for our Faith Home, Wesley on the Hill. Not for tax purposes, obviously, but to seek vision for Wesley's Mission and Value. We are discovering how we can best share God's Love, starting with the children and emanating into our community; to share Jesus with children and families in and around our Wesley Family and community.

As we worship this Easter, be proud of your faithful all enabling giving, (Thank you!) because you make it possible to follow and share Jesus allowing Wesley to accomplish God's Mission with our vision for the future.

Growing Deeper In Faith This Easter

TONIGHT'S SCRIPTURE

"Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under Heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved" - Acts 4:12

SOMETHING TO PONDER

Easter is a treasured time when families come together in celebration to prepare and eat special dishes, share stories, and make memories together. For followers of Christ, it's especially meaningful when we remember the Cross and what Jesus accomplished on it for our eternal Salvation.

In celebrating Easter throughout the years, its meaning and our understanding of it most likely have deepened from childhood to adulthood, where we may keep discovering it anew each year, possibly in surprising and unexpected ways we didn't see coming.

For me, growing up in church as a pastor's daughter, it was a busy time, full of activities for our family, with days and weeks of preparations for our church's commemoration and celebration, including Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

As far back as I can remember, I knew Easter focused on the death and resurrection of Jesus. Yet, even though I knew the story and the importance of accepting Jesus into my heart and receiving Salvation, understanding the depth keeps growing.

Although I grew up singing and believing that "Jesus Loves Me," the realization that my sin was why His death needed to occur took time to comprehend. Like me, many of us are not sure at times that our sin really motivated God to send Jesus, seeing it more as a universal problem, like in John 3:16, which states that God so loved the world.

In some ways, recognizing how sin affects everyone can cause us to have a personal disconnect, preventing us from truly grasping the responsibility our sin plays in Jesus' suffering and death.

Even so, the truth is that our sin is exactly why Jesus died, to atone for it and set us free from a very real debt, one that, if left unpaid, brings eternal death and separation from God.

As Romans 6:23 explains, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Gaining insight and growing through our Easters helps us to realize in deeper ways why Jesus died to give us life, making Easter even more meaningful than ever before. As "Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in Me will live, even though they die'" (John 11:25).

YOUR NIGHTLY PRAYER

Dear Father, Thank you for Your gift of Jesus, sent to save us from our sins and receive everlasting life in Him. Lead us this Easter to a deeper understanding and appreciation for His sacrifice and

the blood He shed on our behalf. Help us to comprehend how He died in our place so that we might be reconciled to You and live eternally. Strengthen us to be courageous and bold to tell others how they can be saved, too. In Jesus' name, Amen.


THREE THINGS TO MEDITATE UPON

- 1. Set time aside to consider how your own understanding of Easter has changed or grown over the years. Go through the years and see where your heart seemed to grasp more of the truth of His death and resurrection.
- 2. If you feel like your understanding of Easter hasn't grown through the years, ask God to open your eyes and heart to comprehend more about His sacrifice on the cross and the significance of His resurrection. Set time aside to read

through the events that led Christ to the cross and to His resurrection from the grave.

3. Look for ways to share the significance of Easter with your spouse, family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, and those you meet out in the community. Ask them to share the insights God has given them through the years.






