God's Answer to Our Deepest Questions

Over the past several weeks, we've been exploring what author Michael Parker calls the **Seven Primal Questions** of the human heart. We've reframed this as the Seven Deepest Questions of our hearts that only the Gospel can answer. Here they are:

Am I safe? Am I secure? Am I loved? Am I wanted? Am I successful? Am I good enough? Do I have a purpose?

These questions are not abstract. Most of us have one or two of these underlying all that we do, our decisions, our relationships, and even our faith. However, each question carries both a fear and a promise — a fear that we won't have what we need and a promise that God's answer "yes" is all we need.

What's even more powerful is this: when you begin to rest in God's "yes" to your question, the very place that once felt like weakness becomes a strength that blesses others. Let me show what I mean with each question.

Am I safe?

The truth is that God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble (Psalm 46:1). When we trust that God is our protector, we carry a peace

that calms *others*. People who've struggled with safety often become the most reliable guardians, offering shelter and steadiness in chaotic times. They help others know God's safety.

Am I secure?

At its heart, this question is about resources: Will I have what I need to live? Food, shelter, and daily provisions. Jesus teaches us to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread" (Matthew 6:11), reminding us that God is the giver of every resource. When we trust Him to supply what we

need, we are freed from fear of running out. And in that confidence, we can become generous helping others find security by sharing our resources and

pointing to the God who provides.

Am I loved?

The gospel declares that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus (Romans 8:38-39). Once that truth moves from head to heart, we know that God sees us, knows us, and values us; we are freed from chasing approval. And in that freedom, we can pour out genuine love for others, not demanding, not conditional, but patient and enduring love that points others to God's love.

Am I wanted?

Scripture assures us that God chose us before the foundation of the world (Ephesians 1:4). We are not accidents or afterthoughts. We are not

redundant or unnecessary. God has a place and a design for every one of His children. When we begin to believe this, we start creating space for others who feel left out. Those who lose their fear of being unwanted often become the warmest greeters and adopters, the ones who ensure no one is left feeling alone.

Am I successful?

"The world tells us to measure success by titles, promotions, and possessions." But Jesus points us toward faithfulness: "Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant" (Mark 10:43). When we let God redefine success as simply doing as God leads, we measure life not by trophies and titles but by the steps of faith we take following God every day. Then we're set free to encourage others in their efforts, without envy or competition. We build each other up in our faith.

Am I good enough?

God has a plan and a place for each one of us, but sometimes we are filled with self-doubt. God answers through grace: "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). Once we accept that we don't

have to prove ourselves, we
surrender to God, and we then
can help others step out from
self-doubt and live in the
confidence of Children of God.

Do I have a purpose?

We long for our lives to matter. And scripture tells us, "We are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). When we discover that our lives are woven into God's larger story, we can help others recognize their calling. Our joy in serving inspires others to step into the purpose God has for them as well.

The good news of the gospel is that God meets us in our deepest questions. But His answer never stops with us. Once you have begun to hear God's "Yes" to your question, you are uniquely equipped to help someone else hear that same "Yes."

Here at Wesley, my prayer is that we continue to become a community where God's answers are not just believed but embodied, where people find safety, security, love, welcome, encouragement, grace, and purpose because they see it lived out among us.

So let me encourage you: listen for God's answer to your deepest questions. And then ask, How can I help someone else hear the same answer? That's how transformation spreads — from heart to heart, from question to question, until lives are changed.

Wesley Family,

While fall is officially here, most of us are still sporting shorts, no jacket, and sunglasses; thanks to what we have come to call an "Indian Summer." Our Wesley Family has been blessed in many ways. Now that most of us have our extended annual vacations filed under memories, we are enjoying all that fall has to offer. The choices are almost overwhelming. Maybe if every month had 8 or 12 weeks in it, we could see and do all the activities that grab our attention. Really, between sports, fundraisers, street fairs, entertainment events, and school activities, we are all going in many directions. This has proven helpful in allowing us to focus on family, friends, and good times; shielding us a little from some of the sad events recently. Do make time to journey up the hill to Wesley for a prayerful recharge, supporting those who need our prayers.

With our new mortgage and no interest, some pressure has been taken off our budget and current expenses cash flow. We are no longer stressed with not being able to cover every expense, but just like at home, something always comes up. Recently, it was the tree trying to cut the parsonage garage in half, and then our freezer needed to be replaced. At the same time, our seasonal propane tank filling, while prices are low, needed to happen. In a short period of time, we incurred expenses of \$3,400 (freezer), \$1,300 (propane), \$2,500 (garage insurance deductible) which added up to about \$7,200. Still looming is having to pay a tree cutter with a high bucket truck to remove three trees nestled against our newly repaired garage. We

would be remiss in not understanding that they need to be removed.
Unfortunately, the gazebo, electric wires, and parsonage wellhead plus the garage itself dictate an expensive removal. We are seeking estimates but are seeing that \$3-4000 is a likely amount. Of course, if we let the next storm drop them on the garage, our insurance would pay, but they will not pay for our cautionary planning!

While it is my duty to keep you informed of Wesley's finances, successes, and challenges, I really do not derive joy in talking about it. But like our everyday lives and homes, things come up and we must find a way keep ourselves secure and safe. Thank you, our prayerful givers, for making sure your church home is secure and safe. Your giving to our current expenses continues to allow your leadership team to plan outreach, inhouse services, and support the community using our facilities, all while we worship together and lead others up the hill to Jesus. Thank you for your dedicated sharing of your gifts to keep Wesley on the hill vibrant and welcoming to all.

Finance Project Updates:

Sanitary Sewer Grease Ordinance

Currently, the Borough has told us that their engineering contractor, Pennoni, is reviewing the ordinance and ways to provide minimum compliance for facilities such as Wesley Church and other non-profit, non-commercial entities. They have acknowledged that we want to resolve this matter by the end of the year.

Borough of Marysville Storm Water Project

Draft plans and legal agreement are being reviewed. Currently, the Borough is waiting on a formal agreement from the Cemetery Association to grant them access for construction equipment, which would be the shortest and easiest access to

our lower detention basin.

Wesley Revised Budgeting and Streamlined Accounting

As I explained in the September newsletter, we are working on simplifying, streamlining, and accepting your gracious giving for use where and how it will best serve Wesley. Our goal is to make it easier for you and Wesley as we worship and support Wesley's needs with our gifts. We are making progress in revamping our decades old system that we now are empowered to modernize and improve. Please know that Pastor Bob, myself, and your leadership team welcome your questions and input.

In planning for implementation:

- 2026 giving envelopes will receive your gifts into Current Expenses which is our general fund that everything Wesley feeds from. Individual boxes formerly labelled Property, Building, and Capital Campaign will go away.
- Fear not, new multi-purpose giving envelopes will be available on our offering table and in the pews to accommodate specific gifts, special projects, and special causes that our hearts lead us to.
- New easy online giving availability.
- Thank you in advance for your acceptance of our need to modernize and make changes, simplifying our accountability for Wesley and the Wesley Family's benefit.






